Hello Huskies!


This year, my sixth as athletic director at NIU, has already been filled with success! From winning the MAC Championship in football, to setting GPA records, to graduating student-athletes at an extraordinary rate, to bringing back one of our own - Thomas Hammock - to lead our football program.

A year ago at this time, I called upon you, our loyal base of alumni and community supporters, to raise the bar in fundraising in order to continue to provide our student-athletes with a top-level experience. As always, you came through.

There is no doubt that without your assistance, Huskie Athletics would not be where we are today. Over the past several years, we have endured some financial challenges, but through darkness comes light and your efforts in 2018 provided that light. For example, the 2018 Victor E. Ball raised nearly \$180,000 for student-athlete Cost of Attendance. In addition, the second annual Huskies Invest: A Week of Giving surpassed our initial goal of \$200,000 as so many of you stepped up, resulting in a grand total of \$272,887 raised through 137 gifts. Last year, we officially announced the creation of the Northwestern Medicine Performance Center, and just recently dedicated the renovated Nelson Suite in the Convocation Center.

Support like this, and the impact it has on our student-athletes, our programs and even future student-athletes, truly cannot be quantified. With your assistance, Huskie Athletics is able to thrive and to excel. In this year's donor guide and in our annual campaign, you will notice the emphasis on unrestricted gifts. THE 4 PILLARS OF THE HUSKIE ATHLETIC FUND

The four pillars of the NIU Huskie Athletic Fund are the primary areas that set the foundation for sustained success. Your continued support in these areas will allow NIU student-athletes and our programs to grow, advance, and carry on the proud tradition of NIU Athletics.

PILLAR #1: ANNUAL FUND

The annual fund is the backbone of what the Huskie Athletic Fund does. Annual fund dollars are critical in that they give us the flexibility to cover a wide range of operational needs. Examples of the annual fund are: The Drive for 25, Forever Huskies Endowment Program and the Varsity Club.

PILLAR #2: VICTOR E. BALL

Victor E. Ball is NIU Athletics' premier fundraising event. This event puts a face on cost of attendance fundraising for the department. By becoming a supporter of this event, your contribution has an immediate impact on student-athlete well-being, first-class education, additional nutritional needs, and competitive advantage, allowing our student-athletes to maximize their potential.

PILLAR #3: GIFT-IN-KIND

Gift-In-Kind is donated goods or services that would normally be purchased by NIU Athletics. Some examples include food and beverage, Wheels Program, nutrition suppliers, printing and training facilities. Your Gift-In-Kind donations are of tremendous value in helping us to minimize our expenses.

PILLAR #4: HUSKIES INVEST

Huskies Invest is the annual week of giving that takes place in early November to bring awareness to our needs and priorities. We have been fortunate in that we were able to raise a substantial amount of money for a myriad of different areas the past two years. This is an exciting event as you get an inside look through testimonials from student-athletes, staff, coaches, alumni and donors.


The Campaign To Sustain will ensure NIU Athletics' ability to carry on the


Cost Of Attendance

Through cost of attendance, our student-athletes have additional resources (stipends of \$2,754) above and beyond room, board, books and tuition. These resources allow them to make the adjustment to life as a college student and supplement their reasonable living expenses, as the time demands of being a student-athlete inhibit their ability to have a job.

- Recruiting




IN THE CLASSROOM


Less than a week after NIU student-athletes posted the highest grade point average in school history with a 3.201. NIU Athletics celebrated more academic success with the release of the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) report.

For the 12th consecutive year, every NIU team surpassed the minimum standard of 930 set by the NCAA to avoid penalties. In addition, every Huskie squad again recorded an APR at least 20 points above the mark. Nine of 16 NIU programs (indoor and outdoor track & field are combined) had APR scores that ranked above the national average for their sport, and 11 programs matched or raised their APR number from a year ago.

BENEFIT ALLOCATION PROCESS

Benefits such as parking, away game and postseason game seat allocations, and events are allocated in a fair, equitable and consistent manner using the HAF priority point system.

The formula for earning priority points is based off of two simple factors and one, one-time allocation. Priority Points are non-transferable.

1ST

Annual Giving Level

Priority is first determined by your cumulative giving in the current year and to what Annual Giving Level you belong to.

2ND

Priority Point Ranking Within Each Annual Giving Level

Accounts are then ranked by Priority points within your Annual Giving Level.

Priority Points are based on the following factors:

Donations

1 point awarded for every \$100 donated to the Huskie Athletic Fund

Season Tickets (Since 2005-2006)

1 point awarded per seat for every year as a season ticket holder of: Football, Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball and Volleyball

Loyalty (Since 2005-2006)

1 point awarded for each year as a season ticket holder of: Football, Men's Basketball, Women's Basketball and Volleyball

Bonus Point (One-Time) Allocations

- 10 points awarded as a Student-Athlete Alumnus
- 5 Points for NIU Alumnus





ALL PARKING IS BASED ON AVAILABILITY

Season ticket holders who donate \$100 or more to the Huskie Athletic Fund are eligible to request premium parking.





COMPLIANCE CORNER

Huskie Athletic Fund donors are “representatives of NIU’s athletic interests” (commonly known as boosters); therefore, are bound by NCAA rules.

GENERAL NCAA RULES TO REMEMBER

- Do not provide anything to a prospect or current student-athlete without specific permission from the Huskie Athletic Compliance Office.
- Only NIU’s coaches and staff members may be involved in the recruiting process. Boosters may not perform any recruiting functions.
- Only after a student attends classes at NIU or begins official team practices does he or she become a student-athlete. Prior to either of these, an individual is considered a prospective student-athlete, even if they have signed a National Letter of Intent or financial aid agreement with NIU.
- If a student-athlete accepts benefits due to their status as a student-athlete or because of their athletics ability, his or her eligibility is at risk.
- NCAA rules apply to student-athletes at all times of the year, including summer and during the off-season.
- Do not provide anything to a prospective student-athlete, a current student-athlete or their family members without... Student-Athlete status is triggered once a student attends...
- NCAA legislation strictly prohibits a student-athlete to receive any benefit that is not expressly approved by the NCAA, Mid-American Conference or NIU. Therefore, if a student-athlete or his or her family members were to accept a benefit, the student-athlete’s athletics edibility would be at risk.

- An extra benefit is any special arrangement or treatment provided to a prospective student-athlete, current student-athlete or their family members that is not otherwise available.
